Ideas for warm-up activities

Warm-up 2

- Present the new vocabulary by writing the words, e.g. mammal, hole, tiny, insect, etc. on the board.
- Read them and have students repeat them.
- Write a sentence on the board with each word, underlining the words in each sentence. For example:
 - Cats, bears and wolves are <u>mammals</u>. Their babies don't come out of eggs.
 - There's water in the boat because there's a *hole* in it.
 - Ants are so small. They're tiny.
 - Bees and ants are insects.
- Ask students to read the sentences out loud and infer the meaning of the underlined words.
- Initiate a short discussion. Ask students what mammals/insects they know of and ask them to say any strange facts they may know about them. Accept answers in L1 and write the names of these mammals/insects on the board in English. Ask students what their favourite mammal/insect is and encourage them to justify their answers.
